Re: Your April 1, 2019 Letter Purporting to Issue a “Notice of Violation” Of A Denied Charter

Dear Dr. Rudolph and Members of the MVWSD Board of Trustees,

This letter responds to yours of Monday April 1st, 2019 regarding what you have erroneously described as a “Notice of Violation Pursuant to Education Code Section 47607(d)”. On March 21, we explained to Dr. Rudolph and the MVWSD Board Trustees that our Charter Petition was denied. That letter is attached.

A school district has two options when presented with a charter petition: approve or deny. You violated the law by attempting to impose conditions and forcing a charter we do not want. We reject those conditions. There is no approved charter here, and therefore no “violation” to “notice”. We have no intention of engaging in your ill-conceived “revocation” exercise. You cannot “revoke” a nonexistent charter.

That said, your letter contains numerous false statements. For example, no BMV representative has ever met with County Superintendent Mary Ann Dewan.
